Competitor Safety Briefing Document

- Please see Notice of Race 22 Risk Statement. Nothing in this document reduces the
 responsibilities on a boat. This document is simply designed to highlight any specific risks,
 mitigations, or contingency procedures that may be useful for competitors to be aware of.
- Competitors should note general risk factors including weather forecasting, and other leisure or commercial traffic.
- In the event of damage to a boat, skippers are responsible for any contingency action required. Race Committee and other support assets will assist if possible.
- In the event of injury to a person, skippers are responsible for contingency action. Casualties should generally **not** be transferred to another boat or vessel.
- If casualties can be taken ashore by their boat, the normal emergency drop off point is on the upstream end of the Harbour Master's pontoon in Warsash marked by hatching. The Race Committee and Harbour Master should be informed enroute.
- In more serious incidents, boats should liaise directly with HM Coastguard for a medevac.
- In the event of any incident, please report to the Sailing Office as soon as possible afterwards to complete an incident report.
