Competitors are advised that World Sailing is checking competitors' Categorisations in accordance with the Class Rules, applicable race documents and the World Sailing Categorisation Code.

Our intention is only to make sure that all boat owners and their crews know they are competing on a fair and level playing field.

Whilst we can perform the checks to influence this, ultimately it is each sailor's responsibility to make sure their categorisation is based on complete and up to date information which enables us to assign the correct categorisation.

Sailors should check their email inbox. If a sailor has been contacted, there is a possibility that the email with our questions has been intercepted by a spam or junk mail filter. Because of this, you should search –

- Question concerning your World Sailing Categorization.
- World Sailing Member Alerts <wsmemberalerts@sailing.org>.
- Spam folder (it does look like spam so please don't delete it).
