A warm welcome awaits you at the Royal Lymington Yacht Club - throughout this event you are most welcome in our clubhouse. On the ground floor you will find our changing facilities, security lockers and training rooms. Upstairs relax in our family-friendly restaurant and bar (and sun terraces too if the weather permits!), that have arguably the most picturesque views in Lymington.

Club Facilities

Café Bar and Restaurant: open 10:30 - 22:30 Monday to Friday and 09:30 - 22:30 at weekends for breakfast, lunch and dinner, with a selection of hot and cold food at other times. We have excellent barista coffee and other drinks available all day to takeaway to the boat park or to enjoy in the club. Free WiFi is available - please ask at the bar for the latest code. There are a couple of sockets in the bar for those hoping to charge phones/laptops, please share these with others during the day.

If wet, please stay downstairs or on the sun terraces. When in wet gear, access to our restaurant for food can be via outside steps at end of the building by the boat crane.

Wet and dry changing facilities can be found on our ground floor, with small lockers for valuables under the main stairs behind the lift. There are also WCs on the first floor.

Training rooms: the Sail Loft and the Slipway Lounge can be found on the ground floor.

Water bottles: refill from the water cooler in the Sail Loft or the tap in the Slipway Lounge.

Reception: if you have any queries, ask our team on Reception who will be more than willing to help.



How to Find Us


Sat Nav postcode – RLymYC: SO41 3SE- (Three Words: lyrics.legs.dozen)

Coming from the East:

Leave the M27 at Junction 2; take the A326 to the South. Pass over 4 roundabouts and onto a dual carriageway, take the 2nd turning to the right into Twiggs Lane. Follow this to the end; then turn left; pass the National Motor Museum on your left and follow the signs to Lymington.

Coming from the West:

Leave the A31 at the Picket Post exit to the east of Ringwood. Follow signs to Burley, from Burley follow signs towards the village of Sway (but do not turn into the village), and then follow signs to Lymington.



Please note that when towing boats the most preferred routes are outlined on the diagram opposite. It is also recommended that you avoid Lyndhurst as this is a one-way system which can become very busy at peak times.

If you are arriving by Sea, Lymington is directly opposite Yarmouth, Isle of Wight.

The Dan Bran pontoon is immediately downstream from the Royal Lymington Yacht Club. There will be yellow RLymYC fender buoys marking out the allocated space for the Regatta.

Please observe the 4 knots speed limit upriver of the wave barriers.

The Gate code for the Dan Bran Pontoon for the duration of the regatta will be 12358*



Parking and Trailers



The Bath Road Car Park, owned and operated by New Forest District Council, is pay and display, with cash or online payment via RingGo (location 2560). The charging period all year is 08:00 to 22:00 (Seven days a week including Bank Holidays), £8 for 24 hours. Please note that overnight camping/sleeping is not permitted. There are two electric charging points in the car

park. We recommend you download the RingGo app before you arrive as card payment at the machine can often be problematic.

Due to its unique use by yachtsmen NFDC is aware that on occasions the car park needs to be used for more that the allocated 20 hours. In this case the driver of the vehicle should purchase enough tickets to cover the vehicle and trailer for the length of stay. The tickets will all have the same date and time of expiry, but the Parking Attendants are aware of this and will count the number of tickets.

For events such as this, we organise section(s) of the car park to be cordoned off for boat rigging and storage. Space is at a premium, so be considerate. For those who require and have booked trailer / parking we have 10 spaces including electrical hook up which are located at the front of the Clubhouse and will be charged at £22.50 per night. Slipway and Access

The slipway is public and must be kept clear for the RNLI lifeboat and other users. Keep the road clear to the Harbour Master's office, the RNLI and LTSC. In particular keep out of the yellow hatched area until instructed to pass through it by the Beach Master. Be aware that it can take 30 minutes to reach the racing/sailing area. Also please keep clear of the red RNLI parking spaces.

Ferries:

The Wightlink Ferries operate between Lymington and Yarmouth and have right of way at all times. Stay at least 100m away from the bow of the ferry when it is moving, any closer and you cannot be seen by the ferry captain. The ferry will not stop for you and cannot change course while in the river channel.



Notes to Competitors: From Class

Jury and Jury RIBs

We have world class Jury for this event consisting of John Doer, Craig Mitchell and David Hudson. The Jury will be on the water observing at 'interesting points.' They have some junior club members who will be in the RIBs with them - they are also likely to be sitting in on any protest hearings.

Media RIBs

Both Media and Jury RIBs will be marked with Cape 31 Media/Jury Flags. Any other ribs coming into contact with yachts should be approved by Ex Comm through the Class Measurer.

Class Rule Compliance reminders

Cape 31's shall comply with OSR Cat 4 safety regs. Be prepared for safety inspections.

21.1. Cape 31 Class Sail Wardrobe for Class Events:

the number of sails carried aboard may be less than, but shall not exceed: 1 Cape 31 Class mainsail. 3 Cape 31 class jibs, one of which shall be a heavy weather jib (conforming to current ISAF Offshore Special Regulations). The heavy weather jib shall be onboard for all races. 3 Gennakers of area 116.04 or less.

Class Measurer will be buttoning 2023 sails and stamping 2021/22 sails during the event.

Weigh ins

Weigh ins will take place on Dan Bran after racing.

Depth and Speed

Harbour Master has confirmed the depth of water is a minimum of 2.5m based on the predicted low tides. But at low tide go carefully, particularly if high pressure.

There has been a build-up of mud either side of the entrance to the river so come into the entrance from offshore rather than cutting the corners. Go round buoy "D" Lymington Yacht Haven.

Allowing for the ferry and other craft try and stay toward the middle of the channel obeying the rules of the road. Please note there is a shallow spot between marker posts 3A and 5 on the starboard side as you come up the river so be aware if coming in at low tide.

As the ferry sweeps around the corner at post 11 that is opposite the south end of Dan Bran it tends to sweep the mud into the entrance of Lymington Yacht Haven so treat this area carefully when approaching Dan Bran or entering LYH at low tide.

Please NOTE the ferry has absolute priority in the river and takes no prisoners. The clubs have a good relationship with Wightlink Ferries which we wish to maintain.



RIB drivers note that recently, in two separate instances the Harbour Master has prosecuted for speeding offences with cost and fines of £4,000.00 awarded by the courts.

When rounding Hurst, going to or from Christchurch Bay please be aware of the new shingle bank called Lentune Island. It is shown on the Navionics chart.

Please note that the Cape 31s will need to raft up two abreast to get all 26 boats onto the pontoons. A RIB can also be moored outside the two Cape 31s but harbour regulations only allow for a threesome otherwise it impedes the small boat channel.

The other side of the Dan Bran has permanent berth-holder's boats and they must have access at all times. Please make sure the boat boxes are on the East side of the pontoon.

Event Messaging System

In addition to the Official Notice Board, the Organising Authority may send messages to competitors and support persons via the Event Messaging System, Telegram. Telegram is similar to WhatsApp but has better privacy (phone numbers are not public), does not limit groups to 150 people and allows new arrivals to see existing messages.
